Once the spraying starts, the signs that have been previously placed on owners piers that opt out of the spraying, will have them mailed to the owners and they will be responsible for posting them.

As explained at last months meeting, Cmr Peekna tested different areas of the river to get an idea of the levels of silt through out the waterway. It is consistent with his findings he discussed last month that he found in Island View Bay.

Unfortunately I will be in Indianapolis next week and will be unable to meet you next week. Below is a note from Bob Hardy regarding his observations on a tour of the waterway this past Wednesday;

not yet reached the surface and, in fact, I could see large "holes" on the lake bottom where there were no weeds. The most heavily affected area is behind the small island on the right as you would enter the lake. Coontail does reach the surface there but I could see the bottom in areas

"Last evening (and yesterday afternoon) I toured the lake and river. The weed population, at least for now, seems to be of low density. In most areas the coontail has

has reached the surface and there were many holes on the lake bottom. The lake is very clear - I presume that is because of the zebra muscle invasion. Over all assessment from my point of view is that at least for today the lake does not have a surface issue with coontail."
